**PURPOSE OF THE CLASSIFICATION:** Under general supervision is responsible for identifying clients who have substance use issues and create care plans that connect them with appropriate treatment services; supporting the clients through the treatment process by offering guidance, moral support and assistance; documenting care plans, visits, and services needed; and performs other related duties as assigned.

### **ESSENTIAL TASKS:**

- Provides in-person assessments and follow ups with clients who have substance use disorder
- Develops care plans that connects consenting clients to in-patient treatment services provided by community partners
- Assists individuals in articulating personal goals for recovery
- Teaches and mentors the value of recovery experience
- Works with clients to develop natural supports, coping skills, and other skills necessary to function
- Documents care plans, client visits, and outreach services in the electronic health record software platform
- Attends staffing meetings with the Tulsa Fire Department's specialty teams to provide information on workflows successes, opportunities and program evaluations
- Reports to work on a regular and timely basis
